学生へのメッセージ

This year, I will teach three types of courses open to 2nd-, 3rd-, and 4th-year students.

"Reading for Discussion" (spring and/or fall semester): This course gives non-native English speakers the opportunity to become comfortable expressing themselves in English. Using a variety of methods including turn-based discussion, roundtable discussion, and debate, members of the class will talk over assigned readings and exchange views in English.Readings are about Japan and are based upon the specific interests of students in the class.

"Keywords in Japanese Studies Today" (spring semester): Keywords are useful tools for organizing our ideas on academic topics and for thinking in English. This course introduces up-to-date English-language scholarship on Japanese Studies, organized according to keywords, We will read important scholarship on topics related to https://literature.music, and cultural studies and discuss this research in English during class. The keywords include gender.subculture.memory, and many more,

"The Japanese Short Story" (fall semester): In this course, we will read short works of Japanese fiction by famous writers from modern, premodern, and contemporary times. We will discuss how to interpret stories from a variety of genres and how they fit into the history of writing in Japan. By reading and discussing these stories in English, we will gain new perspective on Japanese society and literature around the world. This class is recommended for students interested in language, translation, and literature.

学生へのメッセージ

This year, I will teach the following courses to 2nd-, 3rd-, and 4th-year students.

"Interacting in International Classrooms" (spring and/or fall semester): Through this course you will learn and practice skills necessary for academic interaction in English. Among others, we will try and develop skills as speaking, listening, and writing. The topics for each lecture will be about Japan, and selected by agreement between lecturer and students.

"Topics in Japan's Modern History and Historiography" (spring semester): The main purpose of this course is to provide students with the opportunity to read about and to discuss important topics in Japan's modern history using academic English. Contrasting and collating those works with other sources—in Japanese, for example—will also be welcomed. This class is recommended for students interested in <u>Japan's</u> modern history and historiography.

"Borders, Migration and Minorities in Japan's Modern History" (fall semester): In this course students will have the opportunity to think critically about the history and historiography of borders, migration and minorities in Japan's modern history. We will consider a selection of topics widely discussed both in Japanese and in English scholarly works. This class in recommended for students interested in migration studies, minority issues, and multicultural societies.
